



Options for Colorado Business Owners

1. Submit your shutdown story to us in one paragraph. Tell how your business has been damaged by the heavy hand of government. FEC United will submit all stories to Gov. Jared Polis, mayors, city councils, and boards of county commissioners. Spread the word and ask your business owner friends to share their stories. Email your story to testimonies@fecunited.com or submit to us at forms.fecunited.com/written-testimony/.
2. Record your story in 2 minutes on your phone and email to us at testimonies@fecunited.com. We will spread the stories of business owners on social media and make government listen. OPTIONAL: Include this sentence: "Governor Polis, I am holding you responsible for killing my business." Or, if you prefer to name your mayor or other local officials, you are free to do so.
3. FEC United can likely file an amicus brief in *Denver Bible Church v. Azar*, arguing that the Colorado Disaster Emergency Act is unconstitutional. Gov. Polis has used this law to make his countless executive orders damaging small businesses in Colorado.
4. We have identified an attorney who plans to pursue a preliminary injunction against Gov. Polis' executive orders for businesses in Colorado State Court. He is working pro bono. A class action is not needed, and the business that he selects will be able to stand in for all similar businesses across the state.
5. We have identified an attorney who plans to bring a pro bono case challenging Prop 118 that passed in November. This new law will require small businesses to pay an additional tax to fund another government insurance program. Even after battering business owners with a shutdown, the state of Colorado now plans to force them to fund a new program. 6. Ask your County Commissioners to pass a First Amendment Resolution recognizing your right to freedom of commerce and refusing to enforce state restrictions.
